"Dancing Through the Decades" 10TH Anniversary Show \$700 Grant from the Alex "Tink" Wilson Legacy Fund - April 2018

Dearest Alex Wilson Fund,

On Sunday, July 22, 2018, at the Avalon Ballroom, Watch Your Step put on a successful anniversary show. It featured dances from the 1900-1970s, dance lessons and audience participation, cake, and an open social dance. Doors opened at 6PM, and performances kicked off at 6:30. We chose dances from our Ragtime repertoire, 1920s, 1930-40s, and 1970s, with eight costume changes. During costume changes, various members taught steps from each era, and then we had a short period of



open dancing before the next performance segment began. At the show's end, former members joined us for a version of The Stroll, which incorporated costumes from all of our eras – 1900-1970, and dancers demoing steps from their costume era as they were introduced. Two narrators, Joan Hemm and George Bradford, presented the program. The script also thanked the many people who have made contributions to Watch Your Step over the years, from mentors to choreographers. Following the show's conclusion, cakes were brought out, and we finished the evening with a social dance that featured songs from our various eras, all put together by Frank Vernon.

Advertising: We advertised primarily through social media – FB postings on the Watch Your Step! site and the Avalon Ballroom site; personal lists through email; announcements at Avalon dances and through Jim Borzym's email list. We also created posters that were placed around the Avalon.

Donations: Donations were collected at the door, which offset some of our expenses for space rental, food, supplies and marketing. Following the event, we were able to return \$470 to the Fund.
