Slideshows and photo albums covering Melba's 90 years, plus toasts, songs and stories, were followed by a parade of fancy cakes. Leading the parade was 11-year-old Evan, ason and grandson of dancers, playing his nyckelharpa. The evening closed with Melba's pre-chosen favorite songs for swing dancing from the '40s.
