Tarab Retreat 2020 Brings Klezmer, Arabic, Balkan, Indian, and Persian Music and Dance to Participants Around the Country—Online

Pete Jacobs and Meg York are world music and dance enthusiasts and seekers of Tarab—"the magical connection between musician, dancer, and audience that inspires higher and higher levels of creativity, expression and ecstasy." The Tarab Retreat is patterned after the Mendocino Middle Eastern Music and Dance Camp in California and is held in Colorado involving regional teachers. It is a local version of Mendocino without the two-day drive and without the mosquitoes!

The Tarab retreat was established as an opportunity for dancers and musicians to improve their skills and experience the connection between musicians and dancers that comes from live interaction and improvisation. We wanted to put on an event that featured regional teachers, mostly from Colorado and New Mexico, and was accessible to local dancers and musicians. For 2020, due to COVID-19, we had to cancel the in-person event at the La Foret retreat center in Colorado Springs and instead put on a hybrid event with a combination of Zoom classes, live music and dance instruction, and performances broadcast to remote participants using a variety of platforms.

The online version of the Tarab retreat, August 29-30 2020, was a successful adaptation of the live retreats held in 2018 and 2019. We held a Klezmer concert in a park in Denver, broadcast a series of four classes and one concert from Columbine Unity Center in Boulder on Zoom and Facebook live, and broadcast another six classes and one concert from remote studios on Zoom. The classes attracted around 10-12 participants each. Facebook Live concert invitations went out to 646 people. We got 262 Likes and 271 Follows. We got great feedback from participants all over the country who loved the event!
