African Folklife Celebration

\$1485 Grant from the Alex "Tink" Wilson Legacy Fund - April, 2019

On April 12, 2019, in the spirit of Alex "Tink" Wilson's passion for creating events that enliven people, broaden their view of life, and "make life glow," Logo Ligi hosted a celebratory evening of African food, music and dance at St. John's Episcopal Church, at 1419 Pine Street, Boulder.

Grant funds were used to cover the cost of catering, space rental, sound amplification, promotion and a small portion of the musician fees. Total expenses came to \$1419. Income from ticket sales was \$786, with approximately 60 people attending (primarily college students, but a wide range of ages overall). Along with the grant, total income was \$2271 which, after expenses, left \$852 to pay Logo Ligi and the musicians. Though our income from ticket sales was considerably less than expected,



we were still able to pay our musicians at least a nominal fee. In the future we would find volunteers in the community to cook so we could better compensate our musicians.

Our audience was very enthusiastic and we received high accolades from participants commenting on how professional, inspiring, fun and energizing our performance was. The atmosphere was enhanced by the beautiful marketplace of African goods displayed in the front entryway. Audience members enjoyed the food and enthusiastically participated in dancing, clapping, call and response games, and singing. Following are comments from two participants:
